Camp Coaches

Brent Coates

Brent Coates, a graduate from the University of Tulsa, spent three years as OBU's assistant coach before being named head coach before the 2007 season. Entering his 3rd year at the helm, both Men's and Women's programs are poised for their best season's ever. The OBU men's soccer team, although relatively young, has already earned a trip to the NAIA National Tournament.

Under Coates, the 2009 Men took the runner-up position in the regular season with a 12-4-2 overall record and 6-0-3 undefeated mark in conference play. The Women's team finished 9-6-4 on the season ending up as the Runner Up in the Sooner Athletic Conference Tournament.

Coates holds a Bachelors degree in Business Management from TU and a Master's Degree in Education from Bethel College, TN.

Michael White

Oklahoma Baptist added Michael White to the staff as assistant coach for men's and women's soccer.

White also has college coaching experiences as a head coach at Montreat College, where he coached the women's team for five years, leaving the school with the best record to date. He also spent two years as a youth sports developer in Cambodia and Uzbekistan as part of the Southern Baptist International Mission Board.

A four-year letterman and senior captain at Samford University, White also is a certified United States Soccer Federation coach with a national 'A' Level Coaching License.

Scott Carter

Representing Midwest City Soccer club is the coach of the MWC Fusion 92 Girls, MWC Vision 94 Boys and the Midwest City Soccer Club Director of Coaching & Player Development, Scott Carter. Scott holds a USSF National "C" License, Regional Goal Keeper Diploma, Advance National Diploma and National Youth License. Scott states "The greatest thing I have been a part of in soccer, is when I began in MWCS with the MWC 94 boys. They started in U11 they went with a record of 4-12 and only had 10 players.
